Festival Teesside – Hope is Here

We've just celebrated Easter – the hinge point of history when Jesus died and then rose again; defeating death, freeing us from the bondage of sin and enabled us to be reconciled to God and each other. This is the best news ever.

After the resurrection, Jesus appeared to his disciples and told them “Go and make disciples” (Matthew 28:19). He often told the disciples to ‘Go’, and invited others to ‘Come and See’.

In the coming months we have one of the best chances in years to invite our friends and family to ‘Come and See’. Festival Teesside will be a party for Teessiders thrown by the churches of Teesside working together in unity.

There are a whole series of things that will be happening. Have a look at <https://festivalteesside.com/> for loads more info. But here is a quick summary of the things that you might want to tell people about:

Serve Teesside: a chance for us to show people in our local area that God loves them by helping them in some way.

Mission Week: events for different groups like a Men's Comedy and Curry Night & a Ladies Afternoon Tea

Festival Teesside 8-9th June: Taking place in Stewart Park. From 2pm onwards it is a FREE festival for all ages. There will be a children's zone; extreme sports area; football zone; fairground rides; bandstand. Lots of fun and activity for all the family, with chances for people to hear the good news about Jesus explained sensitively and appropriately and respond to it. After 6pm it will shift to a music festival with high quality acts on the main stage.

Whether or not those are events you might want to go to yourself, I encourage you to think about who you might invite. You might wonder how you would go about inviting someone or talking about your faith. Come to a **Friendship Evangelism Training** evening. A number are being held 12-17th May, but we are hosting one here at the Parish Centre on Thursday 16th May. Sign up at the Festival Teesside website.

There are LOADS of other ways you could get involved:

Pray – choose 5 people and pray for them. Or pray for 5 local streets. You could download the Oikos Outreach app, and select Festival Teesside and mark when you've prayed for a street.

Be a Festival Friend – Maybe you could help at one of the events, or at the Festival itself. This could be welcoming people, directing traffic or praying with people. (training will be provided)

Give – This Festival is being done on a very tight budget (for these kind of events) but it is still a £340k budget. Amazingly, Christians & churches across Teesside have raised £310k already! But if you want to give financially, it will enable more things to happen.

This isn't just churches doing a 'nice' thing. This is about us telling our friends and family that God loves *them* and wants *them* to be overflowing with joy, peace and hope. We have the best news in the world. Let us Go!

Susan Pratt - I've been worshipping at St Cuthbert's Marton for about 28 years. I can hardly believe it myself. I came here with Kevin, my husband, before Luke, our son, was born and he is 27 this year. Time flies.. as they say. I really value the support and prayers from people at St Cuthbert's over that time.

I grew up in Cumbria, was baptised at home, on a farm, and went to a village primary school with close links to St Kentigern's, Church of England Church. The vicar came to do assemblies at our school and it was natural that I, and my siblings, went to be confirmed at about age 11. I was married at that church too.

Aged 18, I went to Bradford to study. It really made me think about my faith. There I came across a 'Methsoc' group. I joined The Methodist Society and started worshipping at the local Eastbrook Hall, Methodist Mission in Bradford. I made a lot of great and true friends there, some of which I am still in contact with today.

At about age 18, just after starting in Bradford I went to a big rally. I am sure it was Luis Palau who was preaching. I remember feeling I wanted to go and make a deeper commitment to God because of and at that rally. It seems strange, but afterwards I felt overcome with a deep sense of love for people. I can't really explain it but I believe it was God's doing and his holy spirit in me. Don't get me wrong, I am not superhuman, I make mistakes I am fallible, I am a human being, I'm not perfect, I am not always kind and loving like I should be but I feel I have God with me and he is by my side. I can pray to him about anything. I'm not better than anyone else but I feel God is there for me, in the good times and the bad.

Last Year I heard about 'Stepping Up' a course, run by York Diocese. I had felt, for years, I wanted to do some sort of course to take me further and get me more involved in our community, was God calling me? I believe so. Anyway, it was with Sam Tyndall and Caroline Taylor's say so that I started, along with Kevin, my husband. I have found the course excellent. I am praying and looking to see which direction it will take me.





It's that time of year again when we have to prepare for our annual parochial church meeting which immediately follows the annual vestry meeting to elect Churchwardens for the coming year. The APCM is an opportunity for a detailed look at how our church is performing. We also need to elect PCC members. Under current rules one third of PCC members need to step down and take a one year break to allow for new people to join with fresh ideas.

It is important that church member's come forward to play their part to influence the direction our church and our worship will take. Sadly I did hear that some people have been put off from serving because they have been told that the meetings are stormy. Be reassured that this is not the case, occasionally people are passionate about a particular discussion because they care deeply but there is never animosity or anger as this would no be tolerated under our code of conduct. We are all Christians and are respectful and tolerant of each others views.

Serving on the PCC is not a huge commitment with only six bi-monthly meetings per year commencing at 7.00pm and aiming to finish by 9.00pm. Humour is always present as we remember our responsibilities to be sensible in the use of our resources and support our clergy in this important parish. Will you help us to achieve our aims, you don't need to be an expert, a modicum of common sense is the only qualification.



