

#### A Church with Ideas and Vision

Thank you to all who came to the Vision Day – I was really encouraged by how many came, and the many conversations that I have had since with people saying how much they enjoyed it. Particular thanks to John Day for leading us so ably, as well as Sam Tyndall, Mike Neal, Christine Binnie and Jeni Vigovsky who put in hours of thought and work in planning the day. Thanks as well to all those who helped on the day in various ways.

For those who weren't able to make it, we shared times of worship together, including communion. There were aspects familiar to the 10am service and parts which were more familiar to the 4pm congregation. In between the

worship we had various sessions. We created timelines highlighting our individual highlights and the challenging times in

the life of the church. In reading through all the notes made on the various tables I was struck by the honesty of the discussions that had happened. Alongside naming the high and lowlights, we considered the values that underpinned the church at these times.

Later sessions included thinking about different stories related to the parish including some statistics about the parish

and the current church; hearing about the story of Multiply Ministry (the 4pm congregation); looking ahead to Festival Teesside; and thinking about the work on vision the PCC have already done. After this we did some creative thinking, considering what need to be our priorities in the coming months.

The kids had their own special group, and were also thinking about what they liked about church and the area, where they spent time with people not in church, and how God has made them each with different gifts.

Lots of ideas were generated – and now the hard work starts. We've been working to turn the big pieces of paper into more manageable format, and start to look at themes and key ideas. The PCC will consider those further and then I hope to have some more solid ideas to present at the APCM on Sunday  $21^{st}$  April. This is about the long term health of the church, so while some things may happen fairly

quickly, some of the ideas will take much longer to discern and action.

In the meantime, our thoughts turn to Easter as we continue to journey through Lent. While it is essential to reflect on our life as a church, we must always keep in mind the hinge-point of history: the death and resurrection of Jesus. Without that history-changing event, all our efforts are pointless. Without Jesus, we are merely a social club with weird rituals. Let us prepare to celebrate Easter with great joy and hope in the God of transformation.

In preparation for Festival Teesside I am planning to walk every street in the Parish, praying for God's blessing on the homes, businesses and areas along each road. The plan is to walk most Wednesdays I-4pm. The starting point will vary. The plan for the next few weeks is:




